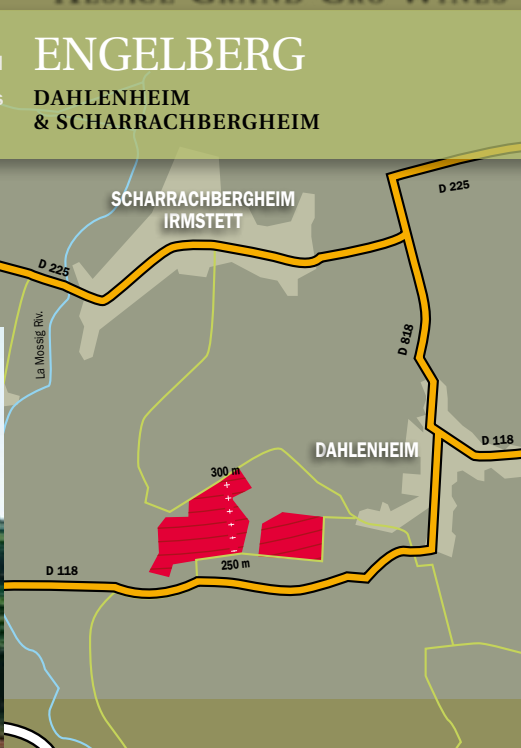


## ENGELBERG

DAHLENHEIM  
& SCHARRACHBERGHEIM

**S**ituated on the soil district of Dahlenheim, the Engelberg covers 14,80 ha of the south-facing flank of the Scharrach slope, between 250 and 300 metres of altitude.

**I**ts shallow soil is homogenous, pebbly calcareous clay, rich in fossils, notably at its eastern edge, where Muschelkalk dominates.

**I**ts southern aspect and rather steep slopes give lengthy exposure to the sun and make an ideal microclimate.

**B**oth Gewurztraminer and Riesling are marvellously suited to the Engelberg, not forgetting Pinot Gris and Muscat which are highly recommended.

**N**oble Engelberg wines were first mentioned in 884 AD. In 1135, documents show that numerous religious congregations including Strasbourg Cathedral owned vineyards on this slope.

**E**ngelberg wines are very well-balanced, full-bodied with an elegant bouquet.

**T**hey are most expressive after several years in bottle and with time develop the remarkably delicate aroma which is characteristic of calcareous clay soils.
